

Pickleball Every Tuesday 10 - noon. Swampscott Middle School, 27 Forest St., Swampscott. Go through the parking lot to the lower parking lot and the Pickleball courts are on the far left. Weather Permitting.

No prior experience and no partners are needed to join us. Feel free to just drop in. We have equipment. The first 15 minutes each day will be a warmup and basic instruction about the game. This is intended to also be a social activity for us to enjoy time outside together. We have two courts and with four people on each court we will have 8 active players at a time. After each game, some people will rotate out and new players will rotate in. In our games, scorekeeping is simply a means to break up the session and rotate more players in. People have the most fun when they keep the volley going, and not by a short scoring point. You will play longer when you keep the volley going. The Swampscott Pickleball courts use the tennis court nets, so the net height is not a Pickleball regulation height. That makes sense since as there will be many situations where volunteers will be inside members' homes and/or driving members in their cars. Driver's licenses and insurance coverage are also checked for volunteers who want to drive.
