
January 29th, 2023, Sunday, 2:00 – 4:00 p.m. Marblehead Little Theater Presents "Party?"

COVID and Flu Vaccines Reminder

According to the U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, 90% of deaths from COVID are among people 65 and over. Also, 70-85% of seasonal flu-related deaths occur in older adults.

While lifesaving vaccines are available, research shows COVID vaccine uptake has slowed among older adults. Only 40% of seniors have received the newest booster. Most pharmacies require you to make an appointment online. If you need help, feel free to call the Swampscott Senior Center for help

Alzheimer's and Dementia in Massachusetts

Your editor is certain that every reader of this newsletter is familiar with someone suffering with memory loss and probably with someone who is a caregiver. Here are some statistics about Alzheimer's in Massachusetts:

- 130,000 people aged 65 and older are living with Alzheimer's
- 284,000 family caregivers bear the burden of the disease in MA
- 411 million hours of unpaid care provided by those caregivers

20% of seniors over 65 (and 10% of those over 45) suffer mild cognitive impairment (commonly called dimentia).

If you are a caregiver of someone with memory issues, please call the Seaglass office and ask for a Courtesy card that you can hand to a waiter/waitress or shopkeeper when necessary.
